Brahms' A German Requiem by candlelight

Music for Remembrance, Peace and Reconciliation

Saturday 9 November 7.00pm

The critically acclaimed Abbey Choirs present Brahms' A German Requiem on this Remembrance weekend. It is one of the most beautiful and poignant choral works ever written. Many believe it was inspired by the death of the composer's mother in 1865 as the fifth movement has a beautiful and serene soprano solo '*And ye now therefore have sorrow: but I will see you again'* followed by the chorus singing words from *As one whom his mother comforts, so will I comfort you*.

Brahms chose the text from the Lutheran Bible and it is the first Requiem in the vernacular and not adopting the Catholic liturgy, leading many to nickname it the first protestant Requiem. The work was first performed in 1868 on Good Friday in Bremen Cathedral, Germany. The most famous movement setting psalm 84 'How lovely is thy dwelling place' is the central movement and has captivated audiences and singers alike since its first performance. This performance will feature the piano duet accompaniment making the music more affecting and intimate. The piano is played by Dewi Rees and Katrine Reimers with poignant readings chosen by Jeremy Key-Pugh.

As we celebrate the 275th anniversary of possibly the greatest composer of all time, Johann Sebastian Bach, Huw Williams plays the complete works of Bach on the magnificent Klais organ.

This will be a once in a lifetime opportunity to hear these famous works presented by one player in one city. This inspiring and wonderful music, in a wide variety of styles from the sunny optimism of the Italian influenced Trio Sonatas and concerti, to the more majestic mature preludes and fugues, will be presented across 16 concerts between November 2024 and September 2025.
